This is a national event which is designed to get everybody, young and old, artistic and non-artistic, drawing for the sheer pleasure of it! Sam is brilliant at bringing out the best in everyone and producing stunning results, which are then displayed for everyone to admire. This year's theme is autumn and harvest time, so come along and have a thoroughly enjoyable afternoon, use your imagination and forget about the dreadful summer!

Looking ahead to 3 November, we are organising an evening with a difference, with entertainment provided by the Leeds Waits. Four members of the Waits, dressed in full blue and gold livery with silver badges, will perform a wide variety of music on period instruments and are planning to include a puppet play as part of their programme. For this event, the audience will once again be gathered round the fire in The Folly and there will be an interval with appropriate refreshments. Places will be limited to 30 for this event, so make sure you book your ticket in good time.

- Saturday, 3 November, 7.30 pm: **Leeds Waits:** A 17th century entertainment in costume: The Leeds Waits perform a varied programme on period instruments. Tickets in advance: £10, including refreshments
