As part of the Craven and the First World War project some of the volunteers from the Museum of North Craven Life will be on hand at this event at Giggleswick School to raise awareness of the whole project, to support Yorkshire Dales Parks Authority Community Archaeology and to publicise our new exhibitions at the Folly which open on July 1st.

They are, firstly: 'War Beckons' - on the centenary of the outbreak of WW1, this exhibition hopes to show the reaction of the people of the North Craven District to events that took place in the early part of the War, both locally and overseas; secondly: 'Journeys Through a Family Archive' - on the 100th anniversary of the publishing of Frederic Riley's book The Ribble - from its Source to the Sea the aim of this exhibition is to showcase the Riley family's legacy to Settle in the form of the rich archive they left behind; also to stress the importance of such archives as valid social history documents.
